### Chapter 209.

Снар. 209

Resolve, in Favor of Limerick Academy Providing for the Payment of Aid Money Not Received by It, for the Year Nineteen Hundred Four.

Limerick

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid to the trustees of Limerick Academy, in favor of. academy in the town of Limerick, in York county, to compensate said institution for the academy aid which it should have, but has not, received from the state for the year ending July first, nineteen hundred four, owing to the fact that the proper returns were not filed for that period.

### Chapter 210.

Resolve, in Favor of the Canaan Lake Fish Screen Association of Camden,

Resolved, that the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) be and is hereby appropriated to be paid to the Canaan Lake Fish Screen Association of Camden, Maine, to partially compensate said association for money expended in screening the two outlets of Canaan lake.

#### Chapter 211.

Resolve, in Favor of Building a Feeding Pond at the Knox County Hatchery at Camden.

Resolved, that there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred thirteen, the same to be expended by the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, under the direction of the governor and council, for the purpose of building a feeding pond for fish at the Knox county fish hatchery at Camden, Maine.

### Chapter 212.

Resolve, in Favor of Paying Certain Bills Contracted for Placing a Rail in the Rear of the House of Representatives, and Marking the Members' Desks.

Resolved, that the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Tracy and Metcalf of Augusta, the sum of two hundred and forty-eight dollars and forty-six cents (248.46), that being the amount of their bill for making and
