Chapter 228.

Resolve, in Favor of Law Reporting Company for Material Furnished the State Librarian.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of one thousand eight hundred dollars to be paid the Law Reporting Company of New York city for materials furnished the state librarian at his request. The same is accepted to be payment in full of all claims of said Law Reporting Company of New York city against the State of Maine.

Chapter 229.

Resolve, for Further Public Instruction in Forestry.

Resolved, that the sum of thirty-five hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and thirteen, and the sum of thirty-five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and fourteen, for the purpose of public instruction in forestry. Said fund to be administered by the same board of commissioners and in the same manner as heretofore. (R. S. 1903, chap. 7, sec. 65.)

Chapter 230.

Resolve, Providing for Certain Repairs and Improvements of the Capitol Building and Grounds.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of seven thousand dollars to be expended during the year nineteen hundred and thirteen in repairing and improving the Capitol building and grounds as follows:

CHAP. 231 Said appropriation to be expended under the supervision of the superintendent of public buildings, and should any part of the appropriation remain unexpended at the end of said year it shall not lapse but may be expended in the succeeding year.

Resolve, in Favor of Bridgton Academy for the Repair of the Buildings at Said Institution.

Bridgton Academy, in favor of.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated in favor of the trustees of Bridgton academy the sum of five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred thirteen and the sum of five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fourteen, said sums to be expended under the direction of said trustees for the purpose of repairing the buildings of Bridgton academy at North Bridgton, in the county of Cumberland.

Resolve, in Favor of the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital for Money Expended.

Eastern Maine Insane Hospital, in favor of.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of eleven hundred dollars and fifty-nine cents, for the use of the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital in the year nineteen hundred thirteen for the following purposes: for money paid out for interest on notes and purchases, one thousand dollars and fifty-nine cents and for increase in the salary allowed to L. W. Somers by the trustees, one hundred dollars.

Chapter 233.

Resolve, in Favor of National Aid for the Improvement of Postal Roads.

Postal roads, in favor of national aid, for improvement of.

Whereas the National government has set aside ten thousand dollars to be expended on about fifty miles of road in the state which is used by rural delivery mail carriers, on condition that there be raised an additional sum of twenty thousand dollars, the two amounts together to constitute a joint fund of at least thirty thousand dollars for the improvement of said fifty miles of road, therefore be it Resolved: That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of twenty thousand dollars for said purpose, that the same be expended under the direction of the state highway department in so far as the same shall not be incon-
