CHAP. 324**Chapter 324.**

Resolve, in Favor of F. P. Washburn, Secretary of the Committee on Indian Affairs, for the Expenses of That Committee in Visiting the Penobscot Reservation at Old Town.

Resolved, that there be paid to F. P. Washburn, secretary of the committee on Indian affairs, the sum of thirteen dollars and eighty-six cents, the same being the amount of expenses incurred by the members of this committee in visiting the Penobscot reservation at Old Town.

Chapter 325.

Resolve, Making an Appropriation for the Purpose of Obtaining Information in Regard to Wild Lands for the Purposes of Taxation.

Resolved, that the sum of five thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and thirteen and a like sum for the year nineteen hundred and fourteen, to be expended by the board of state assessors under the direction of the governor and council, for the purpose of employing a competent person or persons whose duty it shall be to assist said board in verifying and perfecting, so far as practicable, a proper description of each parcel or tract of wild land, and the individual or corporate ownership thereof in townships not incorporated, in order that such lands may be properly described for taxation purposes, and for incorporating such descriptions in deeds when the lands are sold for taxes; also for the employment of competent person or persons to assist said board of state assessors in making special exploration of wild land townships to ascertain for taxation purposes their just and fair value. Said board in their regular report shall incorporate a report of the work done under this resolve and a summarized statement of their expenditures.

Chapter 326.

Resolve, in Favor of Mary H. Perkins for Services as Stenographer to the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House and for Clerical Assistance in the Office of the Secretary of the Senate.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to Mary H. Perkins the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars

for services as stenographer to the president of the senate and speaker of the house and for clerical assistance in the office of the secretary of the senate during the present session of the legislature. CHAP. 327

Chapter 327.

Resolve, in Favor of the Appointment of Three Commissioners by the Governor to Act with the Commissioners from Certain Other States in Proposing and Recommending a Uniform Code of Laws for Motor Vehicles to be Adopted by the Legislatures of Said States.

Resolved, 1. That the governor of this state be and he is hereby authorized to appoint three commissioners on the part of the state of Maine to act with commissioners appointed or to be appointed by the governors of the states of Vermont, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware and Maryland, under resolutions similar to this, whose duty it shall be to ascertain whether the laws of the above mentioned states in reference to defining motor vehicles and providing for the registration of the same and licensing of drivers thereof, fixing rules regulating the use and speed of motor vehicles; fixing the amount of license and registration fees; prescribing and regulating process and service thereof and proceedings for the violation of the provisions of acts relative to same and penalties for said violations, can be so amended that the laws of the above mentioned states be uniform in the above mentioned or other particulars.

2. Said commissioners shall report their findings and recommendations at the next session of the legislature.

3. The members of the commission shall serve without salary, but all necessary expenses including clerical help shall be paid from any unexpended balance in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, upon the approval of the bills for the said expenses by the state auditor.
