Chapter 12.

CHAP. 12

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in the Tributaries to Pattee's Pond, and in a Portion of Wilson Brook, a Tributary to the Outlet of Said Pond in Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to Pattee's pond, which pond is situated in the town of Winslow, in the county of Kennebec, or in Wilson brook, so-called, from the Abbott road, so-called, to the junction of said brook with the outlet stream of said Pattee's pond. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful to take suckers with spears during April and May of each year in the above-named waters. No person shall have in possession any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Fishing in certain waters in Kennebec county, prohibited.

Chapter 13.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Hooper Pond and Its Tributaries in the Town of Greene, in the County of Androscoggin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Hooper pond, so-called, in the town of Greene, in the county of Androscoggin, except from the time the ice is out of said pond in the spring of each year until the thirtieth day of September following. No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to said pond. No person shall have in possession any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs of prosecution for each offense, and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.
