As Passed by the Seventy-Seventh Legislature

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by striking out the word "twenty-three" in the third line thereof and substituting in place thereof the word 'twenty-five,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows: CHAP. 74

'Section 97. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the three preceding sections, there is hereby appropriated the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars annually, which sum shall be deducted and set aside therefor by the Treasurer of State from the annual school funds of the State.'

Chapter 74.

An Act to Amend Section Three of Chapter Fifty-eight of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to the State Certification of Teachers of Public Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter fifty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen is hereby amended by striking out the words "unless he is seventeen years of age and has completed a standard high school or academy course shall be eligible for a certificate," in the sixth, seventh and eighth lines thereof and by substituting in place thereof the following: 'shall be eligible for a certificate unless he is at least seventeen years of age and has completed not less than a standard secondary school course, or unless he shall present satisfactory evidence of such educational attainment otherwise secured as may be adjudged by the State Superintendent of Public Schools to be the equivalent of said standard secondary school course,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 3. Certificates of qualification signed by the State Superintendent of Public Schools shall be granted to all candidates who pass satisfactory examinations in such branches as are required or permitted by law to be taught in the public schools and who in other respects fulfill the proper requirements, provided, however, that no person shall be eligible for a certificate unless he is at least seventeen years of age and has completed not less than a standard secondary school course, or unless he shall present satisfactory evidence of such educational attainment otherwise secured as may be adjudged by the State Superintendent of Public Schools to be the equivalent of said standard secondary school course. Such certificate shall be either probationary or permanent and shall indicate the grade of schools which the person named therein is qualified

Kinds of certificates issued.

CHAP. 75 to teach. Provided, however, that the certificate may be granted without the examination herein prescribed to graduates of colleges and Maine State Normal Schools, or of other normal training schools having a two years' course for graduates of high schools or academies, and to teachers of two years' service and satisfactory fitness, on the presentation of such evidence of fitness and under such special conditions as the State Superintendent of Public Schools may prescribe. Provided, further, that certificates may, under the rules prescribed by the State Superintendent, be granted to persons holding state certificates granted by authority of other states. Provided, further, that any certificate granted under this or any preceding act may for sufficient cause be revoked and annulled.'

Chapter 75.

An Act to Amend Section Forty-eight of Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Hunting on Kineo Point, in Kineo, in the County of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-eight of chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, is hereby amended by striking out all of said section and by substituting therefor the following section:

Hunting on
Kineo point
prohibited.

'Section 48. No person shall at any time hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal or bird on Kineo point, in Kineo, in the county of Piscataquis. Whoever violates this section shall pay a fine of fifty dollars and costs for each offense.'

Chapter 76.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Certain Waters in Township Number Six, Range Two, N. B. K. P., or Forsyth Township, and in Township Number Six, Range One, N. B. K. P., or Holeb Township, in the County of Somerset.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. No person shall take, catch or kill more than five pounds of fish in all, in any one day, in Big Turner pond, Little Turner pond, or in the Calf Pasture, so-called, adjacent to said
