Chapter 157.

CHAP. 157

An Act to Amend Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Portions of Rangeley Stream, Kennebago Stream and Little Kennebago Stream, in the Counties of Franklin and Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

So much of chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, as prohibits fishing in that portion of Rangeley stream from the sign at the old wharf, near the head of said stream, down to the dam across said stream, in the county of Franklin, and in that portion of Kennebago stream from Big Falls, on said stream, to Indian Rock, in Oxford county and in Franklin county, and in that portion of Little Kennebago stream, from Little Kennebago lake to its junction with Kennebago stream, in Franklin county, from September fifteenth to September thirtieth of each year, both days inclusive, in accordance with the special regulations applying to fishing in said streams now provided in section two of said chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, is hereby repealed.

Fishing permitted at certain times in certain waters of Franklin and Oxford counties.

—Rangeley stream.
—Kennebago stream.

—Little Kennebago stream.

Chapter 158.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Horseshoe Pond, in West Bowdoin College Township, in the County of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

For a period of five years from the time this act shall take effect, no person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish, at any time, in Horseshoe pond, in West Bowdoin College township, so-called, in the county of Piscataquis, from the first day of October of each year until the thirtieth day of June of the following year, both days inclusive; nor shall any person have in possession, at any time, any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs of prosecution for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Horseshoe pond closed to fishing for five years.
