Chapter 176.

An Act to Amend Chapter One Hundred Eighty-two of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seven, Providing That Flags Shall be Furnished to Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Ch. 182, P. L., 1907, amended by striking out entire section and redrafting said chapter. Chapter one hundred eighty-two of the Public Laws of nine-teen hundred seven is hereby amended by striking out all of said chapter preceding the word "to" in the seventh line thereof and by inserting in place thereof the following: 'It shall be the duty of the superintendents of schools to see that the flag is displayed from all public school buildings on appropriate occasions. Said superintendents shall report annually to the towns the amount necessary to furnish the public schools with suitable flags and flag staffs and towns shall annually appropriate a sufficient amount to defray the necessary cost of the display of the flag. The appropriation for this purpose shall be separate from and additional to all other appropriations for schools. It shall be the duty of instructors to impress upon the youth by suitable references and observances the significance of the flag,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Towns shall approriate annually amount necessary for procuring flags and flagstaffs as recommended by the town Supt. of schools.—appropriation shall be separate. Duty of instructors respecting flags.

'It shall be the duty of the superintendents of schools to see that the flag is displayed from the public school buildings on appropriate occasions. Said superintendents shall report annually to the towns the amount necessary to furnish the public schools with suitable flags and flag staffs and towns shall annually appropriate a sufficient amount to defray the necessary cost of the display of the flag. The appropriation for this purpose shall be separate from and additional to all other appropriations for schools. It shall be the duty of instructors to impress upon the youth by suitable references and observances the significance of the flag, to teach them the cost, the object and principles of our government, the great sacrifices of our forefathers, the important part taken by the Union army in eighteen hundred sixty-one to eighteen hundred sixty-five, and to teach them to love, honor and respect the flag of our country that cost so much and is so dear to every true American citizen.'
