Chapter 188.

CHAP. 188

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Dead Cambridge River and Other Waters, in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time, in Dead Cambridge river, in Upton in township C Surplus, in Oxford county, from Umbagog lake to C pond, or in C pond, in said township C Surplus, except by the ordinary method of casting with artificial flies or fly fishing; nor shall any person fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to said Dead Cambridge river, except Swift Cambridge river, or in any of the tributaries to said C pond. No person shall have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Fishing prohibited in certain waters of Oxford county.

Chapter 189.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Simpson Pond, in the Town of Roque Bluffs, in the County of Washington.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any trout at any time in Simpson pond, so-called, in the town of Roque Bluffs, in the county of Washington, except during the months of May, June and September of each year it shall be lawful to fish for and take trout in said pond in accordance with the general law of the State relating to trout fishing. Provided, further, that no person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in said pond at any time on Sunday. Provided, further, that no person shall have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this section. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Closed time on fish in Simpson pond.

Sunday fishing prohibited in said pond.
