#### Chapter 335.

An Act to Equalize the Salaries of the Clerks of the Judicial Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The clerks of the judicial courts in the several Salaries of counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties, in quarterly payments, on the first days of January, April, July and October, as follows:

shall be counties as herein

Androscoggin, two thousand dollars; Aroostook, two thou-provided. sand dollars: Cumberland, twenty-five hundred dollars: Cumberland, deputy clerk, eighteen hundred dollars; Franklin, twelve hundred dollars; Hancock, eighteen hundred dollars; Kennebec, twenty-three hundred fifty dollars; Knox, thirteen hundred dollars; Lincoln, one thousand dollars; Oxford, sixteen hundred dollars; Penobscot, twenty-two hundred dollars; Piscataquis, twelve hundred dollars; Sagadahoc, seventeen hundred dollars; Somerset, eighteen hundred dollars; Waldo, twelve hundred dollars; Washington, fourteen hundred fifty dollars; York, nineteen hundred dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation for the performance of all duties required of clerks, including those sation in full. performed by them as clerks of the Supreme Judicial court, Superior and county commissioners courts, or by clerks pro tempore, employed by them.

Section 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the -inconsistent acts provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Any official now receiving a salary greater than -present is herein provided shall continue to receive his present salary not lessened. until the expiration of his term of office.
