Chapter 18.

An Act to Fix the Salary of the Judge of the Belfast Municipal Court,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

–annual salary.

-account

for fees.

The judge of the Belfast municipal court shall receive as compensation an annual salary of six hundred dollars, payable quarterly, from the county treasury of the county of Waldo, on the first days of January, April, July and October. He shall account quarterly under oath to the treasurer of said county for all fees received by him, or payable to him by virtue of his office, specifying the items; and shall pay the whole amount of the same to the treasurer of the county of Waldo.

Chapter 19.

An Act to Amend Section Fifteen of Chapter Three Hundred Ninetythree of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nine, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Twenty of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relative to an Increase in the Salary of the Judge of the Millinocket Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Ch. 393, Sec. 15, P. & S., Laws 1909, further amended.

Section fifteen of chapter three hundred ninety-three of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred nine, as amended by chapter two hundred twenty of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, is hereby further amended by striking out the word "six" in the second line and inserting in place thereof the word 'eight; also by striking out the word "paid" in the last line of said section and inserting in place thereof the word 'payable, so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

-salary of judge.

-recorder's salary. 'Section 15. The judge shall receive a salary, in full for all services, of eight hundred dollars per annum to be paid him by the county of Penobscot, and the recorder a salary of four hundred dollars per annum, payable quarterly.'
