under a penalty of one dollar for each lobster so taken, caught, killed or destroyed and under a penalty of five dollars for each lobster trap so set for said purpose. CHAP. 86

—penalty.

Section 2. This act shall not prohibit the catching, taking, shipping, or otherwise handling lobsters that are caught outside these bounds or held in cars or pounds.

—shall not prohibit.

Section 3. All fines and penalties under this act may be recovered as provided in section forty-eight of chapter two hundred eighty-five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-seven.

—fines and penalties, how recovered.

Chapter 86.

An Act to Provide for Conducting Scientific Investigations Bearing upon the Agriculture of Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Maine Agricultural Experiment Station, in addition to investigations now conducted by it, shall conduct scientific investigations bearing upon the agriculture of Aroostook county for the purpose of making effective section four of chapter one hundred ninety of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen.

—scientific investigation in Aroostook county provided for.

Section 2. There shall be appropriated from the State Treasury the sum of five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and the sum of five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen in favor of the Maine Agricultural Experiment Station, and the same shall be expended by the director of said station in executing the provisions of this act. The payment of said appropriation shall be made quarterly, in advance, on the order of the Governor and Council, who shall draw warrants for that purpose.

—appropriation for carrying out provisions of this act, how expended.

Chapter 87.

An Act to Make Valid a Certain Annual Town Meeting of the Town of Robbinston.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The annual town meeting of the town of Robbinston, in the county of Washington, held on the twenty-seventh day of April, nineteen hundred fourteen, is hereby ratified and

—town meeting made valid.

CHAP. 88 made legal and valid, notwithstanding any defects or mistakes in calling the same, or the time when it was held; and all the officers elected at said meeting are hereby declared to be legally elected officers of said town.

Chapter 88.

An Act Authorizing the Building and Maintenance of a Dyke in the Town of Milbridge.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Persons named herein are authorized to build and maintain a dyke at Back bay.

Joel G. Gay, B. C. Perry, Joseph Wyman, William M. Blood, their associates, successors and assigns are hereby authorized to build and maintain a good and sufficient dyke, at Back bay in the town of Milbridge, to commence at a point on the west side of Grain point, so-called, and to extend over tide waters across the creek, there situated, to land of Alonzo Fickett, in shore from the site of the old dyke formerly built across said creek by the grantors of said Gay and others; and to repair and maintain said old dyke.

Chapter 89.

An Act to Amend, Revive and Extend the Charter of the Stratton Water Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Ch. 342, Sec. 1, P. & S. Laws 1909, amended.

Section 1. Section one of chapter three hundred forty-two of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred nine is hereby amended by striking out the names "O. M. Blanchard, Allen Blanchard, Royal W. Blanchard" and "B. Blanchard" in the first and second lines and inserting in place thereof the following names 'O. Blanchard, Merle Blanchard, Cecil Blanchard' and 'B. E. Blanchard,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. O. Blanchard, Merle Blanchard, Cecil Blanchard, B. E. Blanchard and Ralph Blanchard, with their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation under the name of the Stratton Water Company, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of Stratton village in the town of Eustis with suitable water for industrial, manufacturing, domestic, sanitary
