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and municipal purposes, including the extinguishment of fires, with all the rights and privileges, and subject to all the liabilities of similar corporations under the laws of this State.' CHAP. 90

Section 2. The rights, powers and privileges of the Stratton Water Company, which were granted by chapter three hundred forty-two of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred nine, are hereby revived and extended for two years from the date on which this act shall take effect. The persons named in the original act and those substituted by section one of this act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said original act, to be exercised in the same manner, and for the same purposes as specified in the said original act.

### Chapter 90.

An Act to Extend the Charter of the Washburn Water Company.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :*

The rights, powers and privileges of the Washburn Water Company, which were granted by chapter thirty-three of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, are hereby extended for two years from the time when this act shall take effect; and the persons named in said original act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said original act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said original act.

Charter extended for two year period.

### Chapter 91.

An Act to Extend the Charter of the Bluehill Water Company.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :*

All the rights, powers and privileges of the Bluehill Water Company which were granted by chapter one hundred seventy-two of the Private and Special Laws of one thousand nine hundred thirteen, are hereby extended for and during the period of two years from the first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred fifteen. And all the rights,

Charter extended.

CHAP. 92 powers and privileges that were granted by said act, may and shall be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as provided in said act.

### Chapter 92.

An Act to Extend the Charter of the Corinna Water Company.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

—time limit extended.

The rights, powers and privileges of the Corinna Water Company as granted by chapter ninety-eight of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, are hereby extended for two years from the date on which this act takes effect.

### Chapter 93.

An Act to Authorize the Municipal Light and Power Company to Decrease Its Capital Stock.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

—may decrease capital stock.

The Municipal Light and Power Company is hereby authorized to decrease its capital stock from two hundred and fifty thousand dollars to two hundred thousand dollars. Its stockholders shall proceed in the same manner, and it and its stockholders shall have the same rights and liabilities, as are provided by section forty of chapter forty-seven of the Revised Statutes, as amended, authorizing the decrease of capital stock.

### Chapter 94.

An Act to Authorize the Town of Millinocket to Own and Maintain an Electric Lighting and Power Plant.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Town of Millinocket may maintain an electric lighting and power plant.

Section 1. The town of Millinocket is hereby authorized to acquire, construct, own and maintain an electric lighting and power plant, and for such purposes said town is vested with power to raise money and to provide for the raising of money, at its annual meeting or at any other legal meeting called for the purpose, for the purchase or lease of lands, water power,
