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CHAP. 150 and kept open from time to time to facilitate the passage of fish

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### Chapter 150.

An Act to Amend Section Eight of Chapter Three Hundred Twenty-five  
 of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred Ninety-seven,  
 Fixing the Salary for the Recorder of the Municipal Court of Water-  
 ville.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

 amended.

Section eight of chapter three hundred twenty-five of the  
 Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-seven is  
 hereby amended by striking out, after the word "judge" in the  
 eleventh line thereof, the remainder of said section and substi-  
 tuting in the place thereof the following: 'The recorder shall  
 receive from said city, in monthly payments, an annual salary  
 of five hundred dollars, which shall be in full for all fees per-  
 taining to his office,' so that said section as amended shall read  
 as follows:

'Section 8. There shall be appointed by the Governor, for  
 said court, a recorder, who shall keep the records of said court  
 when requested so to do by the judge; and in case of absence  
 from the court room, or sickness of the judge, or when the  
 office of judge shall be vacant, the recorder shall have and ex-  
 ercise all the powers of the judge, and perform all the duties  
 required of said judge by this act, and shall be empowered to  
 sign and issue all processes and papers, and to do all acts as  
 fully and with the same effect as the judge could do were he  
 acting in the premises; and the signature of the recorder, as  
 such, shall be sufficient evidence of his right to act instead of  
 the judge. The recorder shall receive from said city, in monthly  
 payments, an annual salary of five hundred dollars, which shall  
 be in full for all fees pertaining to his office.'
