Section 7. When any state tax assessed upon any city, town or plantation remains unpaid, such city, town or plantation is precluded from drawing from the State Treasurer the school funds set apart for such city, town or plantation, so long as such tax remains unpaid.

Chapter 182.

An Act Authorizing the Clark Power Company to Construct a Dam across the Saco River between the Towns of Buxton and Dayton.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Clark Power Company, incorporated under the provisions of chapter two hundred fifty of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred eleven, its successors and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to construct a dam across the Saco river at any point between the towns of Buxton and Dayton in the county of York upon lands now owned or hereafter acquired by said company, its successors or assigns, for the purpose of storing water therein; and to use the same for developing power for any and all purposes, and by means of such dam to flow any and all lands on said river or any of its tributaries.

Section 2. All damages sustained by reason of flowage, unless otherwise agreed upon, shall be determined according to the laws regulating flowage damages.

Section 3. Suitable sluiceways for log driving purposes shall be constructed and maintained by said company, its successors or assigns.

Chapter 183.

An Act to Amend Section Two of Chapter Two Hundred Ninety-seven of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred Seven, Relating to the Fort Kent Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section two of chapter two hundred ninety-seven of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred seven, is hereby amended by adding after the word "electricity" in line three

CHAP. 184 of the second paragraph of said section two, the words 'and to contract with the Fort Kent Electric Company' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

May equip and maintain a fire department.

'Section 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized and vested with power at any legal meeting called for the purpose, to raise money to purchase, repair and maintain one or more fire engines, fire hose and all other necessary apparatus, for the extinguishment of fires, to build, repair and maintain engine and hose houses, to construct reservoirs, to contract with individuals or corporations for the supply of water under pressure for the extinguishment of fire and maintain within said limits an efficient fire department; to defray the expenses of a night watch, a police force and all other necessary measures for the better security of life and property, and the promotion of good order and quiet within its limits. Said corporation is also hereby authorized and vested with power, at any legal meeting called for the purpose, to raise money to generate, distribute and sell electricity and to contract with the Fort Kent Electric Company, for heat and lighting purposes within said limits, and to contract with individuals or corporations for the supply of water under pressure for household and family purposes, and the right to do any or all of the above things wholly by said corporation, such as building, repairing, maintaining and supplying water for fire protection and family use.'

Chapter 184.

An Act Relating to the Appointment of Harbor Masters for the Harbor of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Harbor Commissioners of Portland shall have the sole power to appoint a harbor master for the harbor of Portland. He shall hold office during the pleasure of the Harbor Commissioners. He shall, at all times, be subject to and under the control and direction of the Harbor Commissioners. Such appointee shall have had practical experience in handling steam or sail vessels and must hold a license issued by the United States Local Inspectors as master of steam or sail vessels. He shall receive such compensation for his services as the city council for the city of Portland shall establish.
