CHAP. 210

assessment of taxes and add the amount of such tax to the amount of county and town taxes, to be by them assessed in each city, town and plantation or other place respectively.

—municipal officers shall issue warrants for collection of taxes.

Section 5. The Treasurer of State in his said warrants, shall require the said mayor, and aldermen, selectmen or assessors respectively to pay or to issue their several warrants requiring the collectors of their several cities, towns and plantations to collect and pay into the treasury of their respective cities, towns and plantations the sums against said cities, towns and plantations, required by this act which said respective treasurer shall pay to the State Treasurer on or before the first day of December, nineteen hundred sixteen, and said mayor and aldermen, selectmen and assessors, respectively, shall return a certificate of the names of such collectors, with the sums which each collector may be required to collect, to said State Treasurer, sometime before the first day of December, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred sixteen.

—taxes, when payable.

State Treasurer shall notify municipal officers of delinquent towns.

Section 6. When the time for the payment of a State tax to the Treasurer of State has expired, and it is unpaid, the Treasurer of State shall give notice thereof to the municipal officers of any delinquent city, town or plantation, and unless such tax shall be paid within sixty days the Treasurer of State may issue his warrants to the sheriff of the county requiring him to levy, by distress and sale, upon the real and personal property of any of the inhabitants of the town, and the sheriff or his deputies, shall execute such warrants observing the regulations provided for satisfying warrants against deficient collectors, as prescribed by chapter ten of the Revised Statutes.

—sale of property.

Delinquent towns precluded from drawing school funds.

Section 7. When any state tax assessed upon any city, town or plantation remains unpaid, such city, town or plantation is precluded from drawing from the State Treasurer the school funds set apart for such city, town or plantation, so long as such tax remains unpaid.

Chapter 210.

An Act to appropriate moneys for the expenditures of government and to provide for payment of certain deficiencies remaining unpaid January first, nineteen hundred fifteen.

Preamble.

Whereas, the various deficiency items comprised in this act are long overdue and further delay in the payment thereof will occasion great inconvenience to many departments of the State

government and to citizens of the State; and whereas in the opinion of this Legislature these facts constitute this act an emergency measure, which is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. In order to provide for the payment of the several claims, accounts and demands against the State, accrued prior to, and remaining unpaid on January first, nineteen hundred fifteen, by reason of no appropriations or insufficient appropriations, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury, and, except where otherwise specially provided, the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council, is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred sixteen, to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer for the same.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1.
