CHAP. 20

Chapter 20.

Resolve Providing an Increase of State Pension for Sibae S. Andrews.

Sibae S.

Resolved, That a pension of twelve dollars per month be paid to Sibae S. Andrews of Oxford, widow of Freeman B. Andrews, a soldier in the Civil war, in lieu of the amount she is now receiving, the same to take effect January first, nineteen hundred fifteen.

Chapter 21.

Resolve Appropriating Money to Aid in Widening the Turnpike Road in Camden and Lincolnvile and Providing for the Future Maintenance Thereof.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of six hundred dollars in the year nineteen hundred fifteen and six hundred dollars in the year nineteen hundred sixteen for the purpose of widening the turnpike road in the towns of Camden, in the county of Knox, and Lincolnvile, in the county of Waldo, five hundred dollars to be expended in the town of Camden each year and one hundred dollars in the town of Lincolnvile each year; provided that said town of Camden shall raise by appropriation or otherwise the sum of five hundred dollars in each of said years for the same purpose; and that said town of Lincolnvile shall raise by appropriation or otherwise the sum of one hundred dollars in each of said years for the same purpose; all sums to be expended under the supervision of the State Highway Commission. Provided further that this Resolve shall be void and of no effect unless said towns in accepting this appropriation, thereby and in consideration thereof, shall undertake that all road material, including clay, gravel, sand and rock, necessary for the improvement contemplated by this Resolve shall be furnished without expense to the state, and that said towns shall assume and pay all damages whatsoever arising from the taking of land or from the change of grade, drainage or alignment deemed by the State Highway Commission as necessary for said improvement. Said way when so improved shall be thereafter continually maintained under the direction and control of said commission at the joint expense of the State and said towns; the charge against said towns for maintenance of said way shall not exceed fifty per centum of the actual cost of such maintenance, nor an average of thirty dollars per mile per annum; and the payment by said towns of their

said share of said maintenance shall be enforced in the same manner as provided in sections ten and twenty-five of chapter one hundred thirty of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen. The share of the State in said maintenance shall be paid out of the fund for administration and maintenance created by virtue of section thirty-three of said chapter one hundred thirty.

Chapter 22.

Resolve Appropriating Money to Aid the Plantation of Wallagrass in Constructing a Bridge.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars for the purpose of aiding in building one additional cement pier and one additional span to the iron bridge across the Fish river at Soldier pond in the plantation of Wallagrass, provided the sum of one thousand dollars be appropriated by the plantation of Wallagrass for the same purpose; both sums to be expended under the supervision of the State Highway Department.

Chapter 23.

Resolve Appropriating Money to Aid the Plantation of New Canada in Constructing a Bridge across Perley Brook.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars to aid in the construction of a bridge across Perley brook, so-called, in the plantation of New Canada, on the road leading from Fort Kent to Caribou, provided there be appropriated by the plantation of New Canada, or otherwise, the sum of five hundred dollars for the same purpose; both sums to be expended under the supervision of the State Highway Department.
