RESOLVES

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE

1915

Resolved, That the Government of the United States, being on friendly relations with all nations, should take the initiative in a strong movement for continued peace among all the neutral powers, by urging them to join in a long time peace pact, by the terms of which all perplexing questions, of whatever nature, shall be submitted to a neutral international court of arbitration, each firmly agreeing to abide by its decision, and further agreeing to engage in no armed warfare except in case of the actual invasion of its territory or of that over which it has assumed a protectorate, and then only to the extent of repelling the invaders.

And to this end be it resolved, that we earnestly petition the Congress of the United States and the Department of State at Washington to do all in their power to hasten the day of Universal Peace in the name of Humanity and Universal Economy.

And be it further resolved, That one thousand copies of this Memorial be printed and a copy be sent to the President of the United States, the Secretary of State and to each Senator and Representative in Congress.

Chapter 30.

Resolve in Favor of the Western State Normal School at Gorham for the Completion of the Partially Constructed Dormitory.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the Western State Normal School at Gorham the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Trustees of the State Normal Schools for the completion of the partially constructed dormitory at said school.

Chapter 31.

Resolve in Favor of the Western State Normal School at Gorham for Furnishings for the New Dormitory.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the Western State Normal School at Gorham the sum of six thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Trustees of the State Normal Schools for furnishings for the new dormitory to be completed at said school.
