Chapter 50.

Resolve Making Appropriations for the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians for the Years Nineteen Hundred Fifteen and Nineteen Hundred Sixteen.

Preamble.

Whereas, the State of Maine holds in trust for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit: sixty-six thousand thirty-two dollars and seventy-eight cents, and whereas all funds appropriated by the Seventy-sixth Legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds, said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing.

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for in this Resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and in the opinion of this Legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated in the Constitution, be it therefore

Resolved, That there be paid from the State Treasury, to be expended under the direction of the Governor and Council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for the benefit of said tribe for the years nineteen hundred fifteen and nineteen hundred sixteen, as follows:

May divi-
dends.

For May dividends, four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.

November
dividends.

For November dividends, four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.

—poor.

For distressed poor, five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.

—agricul-
ture.

For agricultural purposes, four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.

For ploughing, one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	CHAP. 50 —ploughing.
For fertilizer, one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—fertilizer.
For bounty on crops, one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—bounty.

For salary of lieutenant governors forty dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and forty dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—Lieut. governor's salary.
For salary of agent, five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and five hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—agent.
For salary of police at Pleasant Point, one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—police at Pleasant Point.
For salary of police at Peter Dana's Point, thirty dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and thirty dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—police at Peter Dana's Point.
For school books, eighty dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and eighty dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—school books.
For insurance on church and school, one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.	—insurance.

—janitors' service at Pleasant Point.	For janitors' service at Pleasant Point, one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
—janitors' service at Peter Dana's Point.	For janitors' service at Peter Dana's point, forty dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and forty dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
—fuel.	For fuel for school, church and convent, four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
—painting and repairing at Pleasant Point.	For painting and repairing buildings at Pleasant Point, seven hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and seven hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
—painting and repairing at Peter Dana's Point.	For painting and repairing buildings at Peter Dana's Point, seven hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and seven hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
—teachers' home.	For building to replace old ell or rebuild teachers' home at Pleasant Point, two thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and two thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
—new church.	For new church at Peter Dana's Point, fifteen hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and fifteen hundred for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
—total.	Making a total of eighteen thousand one hundred and ninety dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and eighteen thousand one hundred and ninety dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen.
