Chapter 76.

CHAP. 76

Resolve Appropriating Money for the Purchase of Musical Instruments for the Organization of a Band at the State School for Boys.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of six hundred dollars in favor of the State School for Boys at South Portland; said sum to be expended under the direction of the Trustees of juvenile institutions for the purchase of instruments for the organization of a band at said school.

Chapter 77.

Resolve in Favor of the Town of Newfield, for the Payment of Additional State School Funds for the Year Nineteen Hundred Twelve.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated out of the state school funds, in favor of the town of Newfield, the sum of one hundred fifty-five dollars and twenty-six cents; said sum being due said town, out of the state school funds, for the year nineteen hundred twelve, and not received because of an error in the school census return of said town for that year.

Hopkins and family.

Resolve Reimbursing the Town of Shirley for Money Expended on Account of Certain State Paupers.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred thirty-two dollars and ninety-three cents be, and hereby is, appropriated from the Treasury to reimburse the town of Shirley, in the county of Piscataquis, for money expended in the year nineteen hundred fourteen in furnishing pauper supplies to Mary Donnelley and her four children under seven years of age, state paupers.

Chapter 82.

Resolve Reimbursing Samuel D. Erskine, Moses Erskine, Wilber B. Tibbetts, Elmer H. Boynton and Delbert L. Fowles for Money Expended as Damages for Building a Road in the Town of Jefferson.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of two hundred and seventy dollars to be paid to Samuel D. Erskine, Moses Erskine, Wilber B. Tibbetts, Elmer H. Boynton and Delbert L. Fowles, it being the amount they were obliged to pay as damages for building a road in the town of Jefferson, laid out by the county commissioners of the county of Lincoln, the road having been built under the instructions and directions and according to the plans and specifications of the county commissioners.
