CHAP. 216 Whereas, the Legislature of nineteen hundred thirteen, by chapter three hundred twenty-one of the Resolves of that year appropriated fifteen thousand dollars to be expended under certain conditions for the building of a bridge across St. John river between Fort Kent and St. Francis, and

Whereas said money has not been expended but remains in the State Treasury, therefore be it further

Provisions
applicable
to 1915.

Resolved, That, provided the conditions of said chapter three hundred twenty-one of the Resolves of nineteen hundred thirteen are complied with during the years nineteen hundred fifteen and nineteen hundred sixteen, the said money shall remain in the State Treasury during those years to be used for the purpose for which it was appropriated, and shall be available for such use at any time during said years of nineteen hundred fifteen and nineteen hundred sixteen, to be expended as directed under said former Resolve.

In view of the emergency set forth in the preamble, this Resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 216.

Resolve in Favor of the Treasurer of State to Enable Him to Properly Balance and Settle Accounts with the Various Cities, Towns and Plantations for the Year Nineteen Hundred Fourteen.

Preamble.

Whereas, under existing law the State tax from the various cities, towns and plantations of the State becomes due and payable on January first of the year succeeding that within which the tax is levied and the school and mill fund and common school fund are distributed among said cities, towns and plantations on January first, and

Whereas, legislation is now pending under which the date of payment of said tax and distribution of said school money is changed from January first to the preceding December first, and

accounts.

Whereas, in order to carry out the purposes of said legislation and in order to enable the State Treasurer to properly balance his books, it is necessary for this Legislature to authorize the drawing of certain warrants, and

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts an emergency exists and the authority called for in this Resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety as contemplated by the Constitution, therefore be it

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the following sums and the Governor with the advice of the Council is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of July one thousand nine hundred fifteen, to draw his warrant on the State Treasury for the same.

CHAP. 217

For balance due various cities, towns and plantations from the school and mill fund provided for use in the year nineteen hundred fourteen, seven hundred eighty-one thousand seven hundred eighty-nine dollars and fifty-nine cents.

For balance due various cities, towns and plantations from the common school fund provided for use in the year nineteen hundred fourteen, seven hundred seventeen thousand two hundred thirty-four dollars and seven cents.

Common school fund.

In view of the emergency herein set forth this Resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 217.

Resolve in Favor of the Holy Innocents' Home for Infants for Maintenance.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of two thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen, and the sum of two thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen, to be paid to the Holy Innocents' Home at Portland for maintenance.

Holy Innocents' Home, in favor of.

Chapter 218.

Resolve in Favor of the Hayes Young Women's Home of Lewiston for Assistance in Carrying on Its Work.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars for the year one thousand nine hundred fifteen and the sum of one thousand dollars for the year one thousand nine hundred sixteen, to be paid to the Woman's Christian Association of Lewiston for the benefit and use of the Hayes Young Women's Home of Lewiston, to assist in carrying on the work of said institution.
