Chapter 175.

An Act to Amend Section Twenty-five of Chapter Eighteen of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Appointments of Members of Board of Dental Examiners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 18, § 25; relating to the appointment of dental examiners, amended. Section twenty-five of chapter eighteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting in the thirteenth line thereof after the word "fills" the following: 'All said appointments shall be made in the following manner: The Maine Dental Society may at its annual meeting each year nominate six members of said society who fulfill all the foregoing requirements, whose names shall be forthwith certified to the governor by the president and the secretary of said society, and if said list is so submitted in any year the governor shall, until the date of the next annual meeting of said society, appoint as dental examiner one of those men whose names appear on said list', so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 25. Nominations to be made by Maine Dental Society. The governor with the advice and consent of the council, shall appoint a board of dental examiners, consisting of five members of the dental profession, who shall be graduates of a reputable dental college, and who shall have been in the actual practice of dentistry in this state for at least five years immediately preceding the appointment. One member shall be appointed annually, as the terms of the present members expire, to hold office for five years from the first day of January. After five years from the thirteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and thirteen, no person shall be eligible to appointment on said board who shall have served ten years or more on a dental examining board in this state. Any vacancy in said board shall be filled by the appointment of a person qualified as aforesaid, to hold office during the unexpired term of the member whose place he fills. All said appointments shall be made in the following manner: The Maine Dental Society may at its annual meeting each year nominate six members of said society who fulfill all the foregoing requirements, whose names shall be forthwith certified to the governor by the president and the secretary of said society, and if said list is so submitted in any year the governor shall, until the date of the next annual meeting of said society, appoint as dental examiner one of those men whose names appear on said list. The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, may remove any member of said board on proven charges of inefficiency, incompetence, immorality or unprofessional conduct.'
