SALARIES STATE EMPLOYEES-FEMALE VOTERS.

CHAP. 215

Washington county; for clerks in the office of register of deeds, seven hundred and eighty dollars; for clerks in the office of register of probate, seven hundred and eighty dollars; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, seven hundred and eighty dollars.

York county; for clerks in the office of register of deeds, eighteen hundred dollars; for clerks in the office of register of probate, twelve hundred and forty-eight dollars; for clerks in the office of the clerk of courts, one thousand and forty dollars.

Certain chapters of 1917 repealed. Chapters thirty-nine, one hundred and fifty-two, one hundred and fifty-three, one hundred and sixty-seven, one hundred and seventy-three, one hundred and ninety-four, two hundred and twenty-three, two hundred and thirty-six, two hundred and thirtynine, two hundred and forty-two, two hundred and seventy-nine and two hundred and ninety-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen are hereby repealed.

Chapter 215.

An Act to Provide for the Fixing of Salaries and Wages of Subordinates of the Several Departments of the State Government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Salaries of subordinate officers, etc., to be fixed by governor and council. The salaries or wages of all assistants, clerks and other employees of the several departments of the state government shall be fixed by the governor and council upon the recommendation of the heads of the respective departments.

Sec. 2. Inconsistent statutes repealed. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Chapter 216.

An Act to Permit the Registration of Female Voters for Presidential Election. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Registration of female voters for presidential election, 1920. All boards of registration created under chapter five of the revised statutes of nineteen hundred and sixteen shall prepare a separate list of female voters for presidential election to be held in November, nineteen hundred and twenty.
