CHAP. 253

Chapter 253.

An Act to Increase the Number of Clerks in the Registry of Deeds, in the County of Cumberland, and State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Cumberland County register of deeds authorized to employ additional clerk. The register of deeds in the County of Cumberland is hereby authorized to employ one additional clerk at a salary not to exceed fifteen dollars a week; said salary to be paid weekly to the clerk so employed, by the county treasurer of Cumberland County.

Approved November 7, 1919.

Chapter 254.

An Act to Repeal Chapter One Hundred and Thirty-five of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen of the State of Maine, entitled "An Act to Provide for the Licensing of the Sardine Packers, to Improve the Quality of Fish Used for Sardines and to Establish Standards of Measures for Sardine Herring."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

1919, c. 135; relating to the licensing of sardine packers, repealed. Chapter one hundred and thirty-five of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen of the State of Maine, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 255.

An Act to Provide a Bonus for the Heads of State Departments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Bonus to be paid heads of state departments and members of state boards and commissions for years 1919 and 1920. All heads of state departments, or members of state boards and commissions who receive yearly salaries fixed by law and whose salaries have not been increased directly or indirectly by the seventy-ninth legislature shall be paid for each of the years nineteen hundred and nineteen and nineteen hundred and twenty an annual bonus as follows: upon salaries of two thousand dollars or less a bonus of thirty-three and one-third per cent; upon salaries in excess of two thousand dollars and not more than twenty-five hundred dollars, a bonus of thirty per cent; upon salaries in excess of twenty-five hundred dollars and not more than three thousand dollars, a bonus of twenty-five per cent; upon salaries in excess of three thousand dollars and not more than thirty-five hundred dollars, a bonus of twenty per cent; upon salaries in excess of thirty-five hundred dollars and not more than four thousand dollars, a
