Chapter 3.

Resolve, in Favor of Westmanland Plantation for the Payment of School Funds Forfeited by Failure to File Returns.

Westmanland plantation, school funds. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Westmanland plantation, out of the state school funds for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen, the amount of one hundred sixty-nine dollars and nine cents, said amount having been forfeited by said plantation, because of the failure of the school officers of said plantation to file complete returns as required by law, of the number of persons between the ages of five and twenty-one years of age resident of said plantation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and eighteen.

Chapter 4.

Resolve, Reimbursing the Committee on State Prison for Expenses to Thomaston.

Legislative committee, state prison, expenses trip to Thomaston. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of eighty-seven dollars and forty cents to be paid to the several members of the committee on state prison, to reimburse said committee for money expended on their trip to Thomaston.

Approved February 27, 1919.

Chapter 5.

Resolve, in Favor of the City of Calais to Reimburse said City for Money Expended for the Care of State Paupers.

City of Calais, state paupers. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the city of Calais the sum of two hundred and fifty-three dollars and ninety-five cents to reimburse said city for money expended for the care of state paupers in the years nineteen hundred and thirteen to nineteen hundred and sixteen, both inclusive.
