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## Chapter 70.

Resolve, Providing for the Payment of Certain Deficiencies that Accrued Prior to  
January First, Nineteen Hundred and Eighteen.

Deficiencies not properly payable from contingent fund, authorizing payment of. **Resolved:** That for the purpose of paying the several claims, accounts and demands against the state that accrued prior to, and remaining unpaid on January first, nineteen hundred and eighteen, and which were not properly payable from the state contingent fund, that there be appropriated the sum of three thousand seven hundred dollars and forty-five cents for the following purposes:

### Executive Department

For burial expenses of soldiers and sailors, etc., two hundred and forty-five dollars	\$245 00
For soldiers' pensions, one hundred and seventeen dollars	117 00
For support of paupers, one thousand nine hundred and ninety dollars and sixty-three cents	1,990 63

### State Superintendent of Public Schools

For free high schools, one thousand and seventeen dollars and one cent	1,017 01
For schooling of children in unorganized townships, thirty-two dollars and seventy-six cents	32 76

### Treasurer of State

For damage by dogs and wild animals to domestic animals, two hundred and eighty dollars and fifty cents	280 50
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### Western Maine Sanatorium

For maintenance, seventeen dollars and fifty-five cents	17 55
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<b>Amounting to the sum of three thousand seven hundred dollars and forty-five cents</b>	<b>\$3,700 00</b>

## Chapter 71.

Resolve, in Favor of Mary F. Fernald, for Military Pension.

**Mary F. Fernald of Kennebunk, state pension. Resolved:** That there be paid to Mary F. Fernald of Kennebunk, a pension of six dollars per month, payable quarterly, from the fund appropriated for military pen-
