## Chapter 82.

Resolve, in Favor of Several Academies, Institutes, Seminaries and Colleges for Maintenance and for Repairs and Improvements.

**Academies, institutes, seminaries, colleges, etc. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the academies, institutes, seminaries and colleges hereinafter listed the sum of thirty-two thousand and eighty-five dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen, and the sum of twenty-nine thousand seven hundred and eighty-five dollars for the year nineteen hundred and twenty, said sums to be expended under the direction of the board of trustees of said institutions to the amount and for the purposes indicated in the following schedule:
