Chapter 83.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for Payment of Damages Arising out of Death of Edgar Chase Harnden.

Edgar Chase Harnden, payment of claims arising from death of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of four hundred and fifty-seven dollars and twelve cents for the purpose of paying the following bills, in settlement of all claims arising out of death of Edgar Chase Harnden, an employee of the State Highway Commission:

Chapter 85.

Resolve, in Favor of Rena Cooley, of Augusta, for Pension.

Rena Cooley of Augusta, state pension. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen and the sum of one hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and twenty, to be paid in quarterly payments of twenty-five dollars each, during each of said years, to Rena Cooley of Augusta, for and in behalf of herself and her minor children, Violet and Evelyn, under the supervision of the governor and council.

Chapter 86.

Resolve, Increasing Pension of Catherine Nelligan, of Brewer.

Catherine Nelligan, of Brewer, increasing state pension. Resolved: That the pension granted to Catherine Nelligan of Brewer, by chapter one hundred and seventeen of the resolves of nineteen hundred and seventeen, be increased to eight dollars per month, from January one, nineteen hundred and nineteen.
