CHAP. 111

Chapter 111.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Maintenance of Teachers' Old Home, on Old Town Indian Island No. 1.

Teachers' Old Home, Old Town Indian Island, maintenance. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of six hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen and the sum of six hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred and twenty for the maintenance of the Teachers' Old Home on Old Town Indian Island No. I, said sum to be expended under the direction of the governor and council and the Indian agent, by the teachers on Indian Island.

Approved March 29, 1919.

Chapter 112.

Resolve, in Favor of the Inhabitants of the Town of Industry, Franklin County, Maine.

Town of Industry, reimbursement for money paid Mae J. Smith. Resolved: That the sum of ninety dollars and twenty-eight cents be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the treasurer of the town of Industry, Franklin county, Maine, to reimburse said town for money paid Mae J. Smith.

Chapter 113.

Resolve, Providing for the Care, Support and Medical or Surgical Treatment of Dependent Persons in or by Certain Charitable and Benevolent Institutions and Organizations not Owned or Controlled by the State, and for Other Purposes.

Charitable and benevolent institutions, for the care, support and medical or surgical treatment of certain persons. Resolved: That there be appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen, the sum of one hundred forty-five thousand, one hundred fifty dollars, and for the year nineteen hundred and twenty, the sum of one hundred forty-six thousand, one hundred fifty dollars, for the necessary care and medical or surgical treatment, at the rates specified and in or by the institutions and organizations named, of certain classes of persons whose own resources, or the resources of whose responsible relatives as defined by section eighteen of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes, are insufficient to pay for the same, and for other purposes, namely:

For the care and support of children under sixteen years of age, including those supported away from their parents under the provisions of sections fifty-one to fifty-five inclusive, chapter sixty-four, revised statutes, and acts amendatory thereof, at not to exceed three dollars and fifty cents per week, including direct payments from sources other than the state:

Provided, that the amount paid by the state to any of the aforesaid institutions or organizations during the year for which the appropriation is made, shall not exceed the difference between the ordinary maintenance expenses of the institution or organization, and the receipts in direct payment for board, care or treatment from other sources than the state for the last fiscal year for which said institution or organization has filed a report with the state board of charities and corrections.

And provided, that in case of the Maine Institution for the Blind, the organization of the board of directors shall continue to conform to the provisions of chapter fifty-two of the resolves of nineteen hundred and seventeen.
