Chapter 114.

Resolve, in Favor of Dr. Henry L. Irish, in Payment of Witness Fees, Counsel Fees and Disbursements Made by Him in the Contested Senatorial Election Case from Androscoggin County.

Henry L. Irish, expenses of contested election. Resolved: That the sum of six hundred and forty-three dollars and eighty-nine cents is hereby appropriated, and that the state treasurer be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to pay said sum of six hundred and forty-three dollars and eighty-nine cents to Henry L. Irish for expenses incurred by him in contesting the seat of Edward R. Parent, senator from Androscoggin county, in the contested election case from said county heard before the senate committee on elections.

Chapter 115.

Resolve, in Favor of Edward R. Parent, in Payment of Witness Fees, Counsel Fees and Disbursements Made by Him in the Contested Senatorial Election Case from Androscoggin County.

Edward R. Parent, expenses of contested election. Resolved: That the sum of five hundred and fifty-two dollars and forty-four cents hereby is appropriated, and that the state treasurer be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to pay said sum of five hundred and fifty-two dollars and forty-four cents to Edward R. Parent for witness fees, counsel fees and disbursements incurred by him in contesting his seat as senator from Androscoggin county in the contested election case from said county.

Chapter 116.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Purpose of Obtaining Information in Regard to Wild Lands for the Purposes of Taxation.

Wild lands, obtaining information for purposes of taxation. Resolved: That the sum of ten thousand dollars be, and hereby is, appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen, and a like sum for the year nineteen hundred and twenty, to be expended by the board of state assessors, under the direction of the governor and council, for the purpose of employing a competent person or persons whose duty it shall be to assist said board in verifying and protecting, so far as practicable, a proper description of each parcel or tract of wild land, and the individual or corporate ownership thereof, in townships not incorporated, in order that such lands may be properly described for taxation purposes, and for incorporating such description in deeds when the lands are sold for taxes; also for the employment of a competent person or persons to assist said board

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of state assessors in making such special exploration of wild land townships, and such lands located in incorporated towns and plantations, as the board of state assessors may deem advisable, to ascertain for taxation purposes their just and fair value. Said board in its regular report shall incorporate a report of the work done under this resolve and a summarized statement of their expenditure.

Chapter 117.

Resolve, to Promote Patriotism by Displaying the American Flag at Polling Places During Election.

American flag to be displayed at polling places. Resolved: That the flag of our country shall be displayed in each polling place at every election; there to serve as a symbol of that responsible liberty which finds expression in the suffrage of a free people, and as an inspiring challenge to the youth of America and foreign born citizen alike, who, in its presence, execute the serious duties of citizenship. The secretary of state is hereby directed to furnish a copy of this resolution to the municipal officers of every city, town or plantation in the state.

Chapter 118.

Resolve, in Favor of Esther M. Giles, of Boothbay, for State Aid.

Esther M. Giles of Boothbay, state aid. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of eighty-four dollars and eighty-eight cents to be paid to Esther M. Giles, of Boothbay, as state aid; she being a dependent in accordance with chapter two hundred and seventy-six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen; the above state aid being for the period from the induction into the service of her husband and the date of the filing of her application in writing with the selectmen of Boothbay.

Chapter 119.

Resolve, Accepting the Gift of the Home of the Late James G. Blaine from his Daughter Harriet Blaine Beale in Memory of and in the Name of her Son Lieutenant Walker Blaine Beale.

Blaine Mansion, authorizing acceptance of gift of to state. Resolved: That the state accepts in trust the deed from Harriet Blaine Beale of the home of her father, Honorable James G. Blaine, in memory of and in the name of her son, Lieutenant Walker Blaine Beale, who fell fighting in
