Chapter 123.

Resolve, in Favor of Frank Williams, Administrator of the Estate of Nicola DiNora, Late of Boston, State of Massachusetts.

Frank Williams, administrator estate of Nicola DiNora, damages. Resolved: That there be appropriated and paid to Frank Williams, administrator of the estate of Nicola DiNora, deceased, late of Boston, county of Suffolk, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, on account of injuries resulting in death while employed in the construction of a state-aid highway in the town of Whiting, county of Washington, the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars. The above amount shall be paid out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Chapter 124.

Resolve, Providing for the Purchase of Certain Volumes of the Documentary History of Maine.

Documentary history of Maine, supervision of publication of. Resolved: That the Maine Historical Society, agreeing to supervise the copying, attesting, editing, indexing and publishing of volumes twenty-five and twenty-six of the documentary history of Maine in the same manner as volumes of said documentary history previously published under the resolve, approved March twenty-six, nineteen hundred and fifteen; the governor and council shall purchase for the state five hundred copies of each said volumes at three dollars and twenty-five cents per volume, said volumes to be distributed or exchanged at the discretion of the state librarian.

Chapter 125.

Resolve, Reimbursing the Town of Norridgewock for Money Expended for State Paupers.

Town of Norridgewock, reimbursement for money expended for state paupers. Resolved: That the sum of two hundred and fifty-five dollars and five cents be, and hereby is, appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen to be paid to the town of Norridgewock to reimburse said town for pauper supplies furnished in nineteen hundred and seventeen and nineteen hundred and eighteen to Marjorie and Dorothy Curran, children of Herbert Curran.
