CHAP. 161

Chapter 161.

Resolve, in Favor of Charles J. Hutchings for Services in Assisting Members of the Legislature in Drawing Bills and Resolves.

Charles J. Hutchings of Brewer, drafting acts and resolves. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Charles J. Hutchings of Brewer, the sum of nine hundred dollars for attendance upon the legislature and services there rendered members of the legislature in assisting in the drawing of bills and resolves in accordance with the terms of an agreement between the president of the senate and speaker of the house and the said Hutchings, as authorized by joint order of the legislature.

Approved April 4, 1919.

Chapter 162.

Resolve, in Favor of Clerks, Stenographers and Messengers of the Several Committees of the Seventy-ninth Legislature.

Clerks of legislative committees, stenographers, messengers, etc. Resolved: That there be appropriated the sum of five thousand four hundred and sixty-seven dollars to be paid to the persons named in the following schedule from the appropriation for contingent expenses of committees of the seventy-ninth legislature:
