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dition to the five hundred dollars above mentioned, and at least five hundred dollars shall be expended annually by the library association of said county for books for the library at the court house at Caribou in said county; so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 8. Aroostook County to pay additional \$500 to law library association for law library at Caribou court house. The treasurer of each county, except the county of Lincoln, shall annually pay to the treasurer of the law library association of his county, for the uses and benefits of the county law library, the sum of five hundred dollars. The treasurer of the county of Lincoln shall annually pay to the treasurer of the law library association of his county, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars. The treasurer of Aroostook county shall pay annually to the law library association of said county the sum of five hundred dollars, in addition to the five hundred dollars above mentioned, and at least five hundred dollars shall be expended annually by the library association of said county for books for the library at the court house at Caribou in said county. The treasurer of each county shall also pay to the treasurer of the law library association of his county all money received from persons admitted as attorneys in the supreme judicial court upon motion, without a certificate from the board of examiners of applicants for admission to the bar.'

Chapter 31.

An Act for the Better Care of Inmates of the State Prison and Men's Reformatory Suffering from Tuberculosis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Inmates of state prison or men's reformatory afflicted with tuberculosis may be transferred to state sanatoriums. Whenever any inmate of the state prison or of the men's reformatory shall become afflicted with tuberculosis so that the welfare of such inmate or the safety of the other inmates of such institution shall require his removal therefrom, the board of prison commissioners or the trustees of said reformatory, with the approval of the governor, may cause him to be removed to one of the state sanatoriums, to be there kept and treated until he may safely be returned to said prison or reformatory. In the admission of new patients the officers of such sanatoriums shall give preference to persons transferred under this act.
