Chapter 43.

An Act Authorizing the Town of Cape Elizabeth to Adopt a Corporate Seal.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Authorizing town of Cape Elizabeth to adopt a corporate seal. The inhabitants of the town of Cape Elizabeth are hereby authorized and empowered to adopt a corporate seal, and to use said seal in all of its official acts where a seal is required.

Approved March 15, 1921.

Chapter 44.

An Act to Extend the Charter of the Matagamon Towboat Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Charter of Matagamon Towboat Company extended. All the rights, powers and privileges of the Matagamon Towboat Company which were granted by chapter two hundred and fifty-two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five and extended by chapter eighty-five of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, are hereby extended to March seventeenth, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

Approved March 15, 1921.

Chapter 45.

An Act to Amend Section Two of Chapter Five Hundred and One of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Eighty-nine, Relating to the Charter of Maine Central Institute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1889, c. 501, § 2; relating to the manner of choosing trustees of the Maine Central Institute, amended. Section two of chapter five hundred and one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine is hereby amended by striking out the words "Maine Free Baptist Association, Incorporated by an Act Approved February Twenty-six, Eighteen Hundred and Eighty-nine," and substituting therefor the following words: 'United Baptist Convention of Maine,' so that the section when amended shall read as follows:
- 'Sec. 2. Trustees heretofore selected by Maine Free Baptist Association to be hereafter selected by United Baptist Convention of Maine. The said board of trustees shall be divided into five classes of not more than five persons each, the first five published in the last catalogue of said institute shall constitute the first class, the second five
