of the state of the hydro-electric energy generated therein, thereby causing serious and irreparable loss and injury to the health and prosperity of the state, and to the future growth of industries therein;

Respectfully urge upon the congress now in session the necessity of amending the said Federal Water Power Act in order that there shall be no federal interference with and control of the water powers lying within the borders of the State of Maine, and

The secretary of state is directed to transmit a copy of these resolutions to both branches of Congress and to our Senators and Representatives therein.

Chapter 3.

Resolve, in Favor of P. F. Crane, Secretary of the Senate of the Seventy-ninth Legislature.

P. F. Crane, services in organizing senate of 80th legislature. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one hundred dollars for services, and fifteen dollars for mileage to be paid P. F. Crane, of Bangor, for services rendered in preparing for and organizing the senate of the eightieth legislature, as required by statutes; and for services rendered the president and secretary of the senate during the first week of the regular session of the senate of said legislature.

Chapter 4.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Expenses of the Electoral College for the State of Maine for the Year Nineteen Hundrd and Twenty-one.

Expenses of electoral college. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of four hundred and fifty-one dollars to defray the expenses of the electoral college for the state of Maine which convened at Augusta the eighth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

Approved February 23, 1921.

Chapter 5.

Resolve, in Favor of the Widow of Governor Parkhurst.

Dorothy W. Parkhurst, providing for payment to her of salary that would have been paid to Gov. Parkhurst for full term.
