CHAP. 10

necessary in addition to the above amounts to pay one-half the cost of the construction of an international highway bridge between Madawaska, Maine, and Edmundston, New Brunswick.

This resolve is contingent upon the Dominion of Canada or the Province of New Brunswick making an appropriation to meet one-half the cost of said bridge. All sums provided under this resolve shall be expended under the supervision of and in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the state highway commission.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved. Approved March 17, 1921.

Chapter 10.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the University of Maine for Temporary Maintenance.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the proper functioning of the University of Maine is of great importance to all the people of the state, and necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and,

Whereas, the present financial condition of the University is such that it is impossible to pay the salaries of its teaching staff and other employees from any available funds, and,

Whereas, temporary assistance by this legislature is imperatively necessary to assure the proper maintenance of said institution until the regular appropriation shall become available, now, therefore, be it

Resolved: Emergency appropriation. That there be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to the University of Maine, for salaries and other necessary maintenance, the sum of thirty thousand dollars, said sum to be immediately available upon the passage of this resolve.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency expressed in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 11.

Resolve, in Favor of Mary S. Hillman for State Pension.

Mary S. Hillman, state pension. Resolved: 'That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of three hundred dollars per annum for the years nineteen hundred and twenty-one and nineteen hundred and

twenty-two, the said money to be paid Mary S. Hillman, of Island Falls, in quarterly payments of seventy-five dollars each.

Chapter 12.

Resolve, in Favor of Grand Lake Stream Plantation,

Grand Lake Stream, interest on reserved land fund. Resolved: That there be appropriated from moneys held in trust by the treasurer of state for Grand Lake Stream plantation, the sum of five hundred and fifty-nine dollars and fifty-three cents, of which three hundred and ten dollars and eighty-five cents is on account of nineteen hundred and seventeen and two hundred forty-eight dollars and sixty-eight cents is on account of nineteen hundred and eighteen, for interest on reserved land fund, and not drawn by the plantation in the years named.

Chapter 13.

Resolve, Authorizing the Land Agent to Sell Public Lot Eighty-five in Moro Plantation, Aroostook County.

Authorizing sale of public lot, No. 85, Moro plantation. Resolved: That the land agent, with the advice and consent of the governor and council, is hereby authorized to sell and convey to actual settlers thereon certain lands in Moro plantation, in Aroostook county, lot number eightyfive, constituting part of the school lots of said plantation, if he deems such sales advisable, for such price per acre and on such terms of payment as he may deem advantageous; provided, that in making sales of said lands the legal and equitable rights of persons claiming under said settlers shall be considered and preserved; and provided also, that the proceeds of any sales made shall be added to the school funds of said plantation.

Resolve, Authorizing the State Land Agent to Sell Lot Number Ninety-three in the Town of St. Agatha in the County of Aroostook.

Authorizing sale of public lot, No. 93, St. Agatha. Resolved: That the land agent of the State of Maine, with the advice and consent of the governor and council, be and hereby is, authorized to sell for cash lot num-
