Chapter 92.

Resolve, in Favor of the State Reformatory for Men for Maintenance.

State Reformatory for Men, maintenance. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the maintenance of the State Reformatory for Men, the following sums:

For personal services , namely, salaries and wages of all officers and employees, except those wholly engaged in repairs of buildings and equipment:	
For the first fiscal period, January first to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, inclusive, the sum of nine thousand dollars,	\$9,000.00
For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, the sum of eighteen thousand dollars,	18,000.00
For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, the sum of eighteen thousand dollars,	18,000.00
For maintenance , including food supplies, clothing, repairs, replacements, equipment, and for general expenses:	
For the first fiscal period, January first to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, inclusive, the sum of twenty-two thousand two hundred dollars,	22,200.00
For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, the sum of thirty-eight thousand three hundred and fifteen dollars,	38,315.00
For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, the sum of forty-four thousand five hundred and seventy dollars,	44,570.00
Making a total of one hundred and fifty thousand and eighty-five dollars,	\$150,085.00

Emergency. Whereas, the appropriations specified in this resolve, applying to the first fiscal period named herein, are immediately necessary for the continued operations of this institution and thereby makes this an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety,

Therefore, be it Resolved, that this resolve shall take effect when approved.
