WILD LANDS.

CHAP. 105

Home for Aged Women, Rockland; one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) for the period from January 1st, 1921 to June 30th, 1921, three hundred dollars (\$300) for the year from July 1st, 1921 to June 30th, 1922, and three hundred dollars (\$300) for the year from July 1st, 1922 to June 30th, 1923.

For the Care and Support of Deaf Persons Sixteen Years of Age or Over:

Maine Mission for the Deaf, Bangor; one hundred dollars (\$100) for the period from January 1st, 1921 to June 30th, 1921, two hundred dollars (\$200) for the year from July 1st, 1921 to June 30th, 1922, and two hundred dollars (\$200) for the year from July 1st, 1922 to June 30th, 1923.

For the Education of the Adult Blind, in Order That They May Become Self-supporting, at Not Exceeding Seven Dollars per Week, Including Direct Payments from Sources Other Than the State:

Maine Institution for the Blind, Portland; eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) for the period from January 1st, 1921, to June 30th, 1921, sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000) for the year from July 1st, 1921 to June 30th, 1922, and sixteen thousand dollars (\$16,000) for the year from July 1st, 1922 to June 30th, 1923.

For the Treatment of Tuberculous Patients:

Bangor Anti-Tuberculosis Association; one thousand one hundred dollars (\$1,100) for the period from January 1st, 1921 to June 30th, 1921, two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200) for the year from July 1st, 1921 to June 30th, 1922, and two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200) for the year from July 1st, 1922 to June 30th, 1923.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 105.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Purpose of Obtaining Information in Regard to Wild Lands for the Purposes of Taxation.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the appropriation for the first six months in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-one for the purpose of obtaining information in regard to wild lands for purposes of taxation is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, therefore,

Wild lands, for obtaining information in regard to for purposes of taxation. Resolved: That the sum of ten thousand dollars be appropriated, to be expended by the board of state assessors under direction of the governor and council, between January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-one and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-one and a further sum of thirty thousand dollars, to be expended between July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-one and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and a further sum of ten thousand dollars, to be expended between July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-two and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, for the purpose of employing a competent person or persons whose duty it shall be to assist said board in verifying and protecting, so far as practicable, a proper description of each parcel or tract of wild land, and the individual or corporate ownership thereof, in townships not incorporated, in order that such lands may be properly described for taxation purposes, and for incorporating such description in deeds when the lands are sold for taxes; also for the employment of a competent person or persons to assist said board of state assessors in making such special exploration of wild land townships, and such lands located in incorporated towns and plantations, as the board of state assessors may deem advisable, to ascertain for taxation purposes their just Said board in its regular report shall incorporate a report and fair value. of the work done under this resolve and a summarized statement of its expenditures.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 106.

Resolve, in Favor of Nash and Viles for Services in Connection with Work on Brick Dormitory Building at the Maine School for Feeble-minded.

Nash and Viles, dormitory Maine School for Feeble-minded. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one thousand three hundred and six dollars and fifty-nine cents to be paid Nash and Viles of Skowhegan, to reimburse them for services in connection with work on brick dormitory building at the Maine School for Feebleminded.
