## Chapter 110.

Resolve, Providing for the Payment to Mrs. Fannie Bradley of Aid as a Soldier's Dependent.

**Fannie Bradley, soldiers' dependent. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one hundred sixty dollars for the purpose of paying Mrs. Fannie Bradley of Searsport forty weeks' aid as a soldier's dependent, said sum to be paid out of the appropriation for the support of dependents of soldiers, sailors and marines.

## Chapter 111.

Resolve, in Favor of the Augusta State Hospital for Furniture and Other Equipment.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, the new female pavilion or wing of the Augusta State Hospital has been completed, and,

Whereas, equipment and furniture is immediately necessary to place this wing of said Augusta State Hospital in operation, and,

Whereas, legislation to equip said wing is immediately necessary in the interests of the public peace, health and safety, and,

Whereas, the foregoing facts in the judgment of this legislature constitute an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of this state, now therefore,

**Augusta State Hospital, furniture and equipment, new wing.**  
**Be it Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the Augusta State Hospital:

For furniture and other equipment the sum of eight thousand dollars.

\$8,000.00

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

## Chapter 112.

Resolve, in Favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for the General Care, Maintenance and Education Thereof.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, the State of Maine holds in trust for the Penobscot Tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit: eighty-eight thousand and ninety-two dollars and forty-four cents, and,

Whereas, all the funds appropriated by the seventy-ninth legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing, and,

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for by this resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and in the opinion of this legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated by the constitution, be it therefore

**Penobscot Indians, care and maintenance. Resolved:** That there be appropriated from the state treasury to be expended under the direction of the governor and council by the agent of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for the first six months of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, and for each of the fiscal years ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-two and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, as follows:

**Interest on Indian trust fund** two thousand six hundred forty-two dollars and seventy-eight cents for the first six months of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, five thousand two hundred and eighty-five dollars and fifty-five cents for the year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-two, and five thousand two hundred and eighty-five dollars and fifty-five cents for the year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-three.
