Chapter 113.

Resolve, for a Marker for Maine Soldiers at Valley Forge.

Memorial marker, Maine soldiers at Valley Forge. Resolved: That the sum of six hundred dollars be, and the same hereby is, appropriated for a memorial marker for Maine soldiers at Valley Forge, said sum to be expended by the president of the Maine Society, Sons of the American Revolution, and its executive committee, under the direction of the governor and council.

Chapter 114.

Resolve, Appointing a Committee of Investigation to Procure Plans and Estimates for a State Library Building.

State Library building, plans and estimates. Resolved: That a committee of four may be appointed by the governor to investigate and report to the next legislature in regard to plans, estimates and specifications for a state library building. The committee subject to the approval of the governor and council may employ such assistance and incur such expenses as it deems necessary not exceeding five thousand dollars. The committee shall serve without pay but shall receive its actual expenses. The governor shall be chairman and a member of the committee ex-officio.

Chapter 115.

Resolve, in Favor of the Maine School for Feeble-Minded for Maintenance and Personal Services.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the fiscal year of the State of Maine now ends on June thirtieth of each year, instead of December thirty-first, and no money is available under a regular appropriation for the first six months of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-one and whereas, appropriation for the first six months in nineteen hundred and twenty-one in favor of the Maine School for Feeble Minded is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, therefore,

Maine School for Feeble-minded, personal services and maintenance. Resolved: That there be appropriated for the Maine School for Feeble-minded:

For personal services, namely, for salaries and wages of all officers and employees for two and one-half years; January 1, 1921 to June 30, 1921, the sum of twenty-six thousand dollars, July 1, 1921 to June 30, 1922, the sum of fifty-eight thousand dollars, July 1, 1922 to June 30, 1923, the sum of seventy-three thousand dollars.	\$26,000.00	\$58,000.00	\$73,000.00
For maintenance, namely, all articles of food, all articles of personal clothing, all materials and supplies required for upkeep of the grounds, buildings and attached fixtures, and for general expenses for two and one-half years; January 1, 1921 to June 30, 1921, the sum of forty-five thousand dollars, July 1, 1921 to June 30, 1922, the sum of ninety-five thousand dollars, July 1, 1922 to June 30, 1923, the sum of one hundred twenty thousand dollars,	45,000.00	95,000.00	120,000.00
	\$71,000.00	\$153,000.00	\$193,000.00

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited above, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 116.

Resolve, in Favor of Aid of Navigation of Lakes and Certain Waters for the Fiscal Period Ending June Thirtieth, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the fiscal year of the State of Maine now ends on June thirtieth of each year, and no money is available under a regular appropriation for the six months of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-one,

And Whereas, the aiding of navigation in certain lakes and waters in this state as provided by this resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and in the judgment of this legislature constitutes an emergency within the meaning of the constitution, now therefore be it
