Chapter 146.

Resolve, in Favor of Benjamin A. Swasey, Clerk to the Committee on School for Feeble-Minded.

Benjamin A. Swasey, clerk legislative committee Feeble-Minded. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of fifty dollars, to be paid to Benjamin A. Swasey, for services as clerk to the committee on School for Feeble-Minded, the same to be paid from the appropriation for contingent expenses of legislative committees.

Approved April 9, 1921.

Chapter 147.

Resolve, in Favor of H. G. Smallidge for Extra Services as Assistant Messenger of the House of Representatives of the Eightieth Legislature.

H. G. Smallidge, messenger of the House, extra services. Resolved: That there be paid to H. G. Smallidge for extra services as assistant messenger of the house of representatives of the eightieth legislature, the sum of one hundred dollars.

Chapter 148.

Resolve, in Favor of the Assistant Secretary of the Senate.

Harry P. Hawes, assistant secretary of senate, additional compensation. Resolved: That there be appropriated to be paid to Harry P. Hawes, assistant secretary of the senate, the sum of one hundred dollars.

Chapter 149.

Resolve, in Favor of the Commissioners of Pharmacy.

Commissioners of pharmacy, fees and expenses. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars for the year from July first, nineteen hundred twenty-one to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-two, and one thousand dollars for the year from July first, nineteen hundred twenty-two to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-three, to pay the fees and expenses of the Commissioners of Pharmacy.
