CHAP. 155

following, and provided further, that the governor and council may, by order, upon recommendation of the trustees of the said institution, authorize the use of any unexpended balance in any of the items contained in the above appropriation, to apply toward any deficiency that may exist in any other.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited above, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 155.

Resolve, in Favor of the Central Maine Sanatorium, Fairfield, Somerset County.

Central Maine Sanatorium, superintendent's cottage. Resolved: That there be appropriated for the Central Maine Sanatorium for the construction of a superintendent's cottage, the sum of six thousand dollars for the period from July 1, 1921, to June 30, 1922. Provided that any portion of the appropriation remaining unexpended, shall be available for expenditure during the next fiscal year.

Chapter 156.

Resolve, to Reimburse L. Ernest Thornton, Secretary of the Senate, for Expenses Incurred in Connection with the Lecture of William F. Dawson.

Expenses of Mt. Katahdin lecture by William F. Dawson. Resolved: That the sum of eighteen dollars and sixty-six cents (\$18.66) be paid to L. Ernest Thornton, secretary of the senate, to reimburse him for the expenses in connection with the lecture on Mount Katahdin in the hall of representatives on February ninth, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, by William F. Dawson, who was invited to deliver said lecture by joint order of the legislature.

Chapter 157.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Winthrop.

Winthrop, state aid highways Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of eighteen thousand nine hundred fifty-six dollars and fifty-five cents, to discharge the obligation of the State of Maine to the Town of Winthrop arising from the raising of funds by said town and the expenditure of the same under the direction of the state highway commission, on the faith of the obligation of the state to supplement the same to the amount provided by this resolve under the provisions

of the so-called "state-aid" law, which obligation was not met for want of available funds; one-half of said sum to be paid to said Town of Winthrop on July fifteenth nineteen hundred and twenty-one, and one-half on July fifteenth nineteen hundred and twenty-two, from funds available for construction of state aid highways.

Chapter 158.

Resolve, on the Pay Roll of the Senate of the Eightieth Legislature.

Pay roll of Senate. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of twenty thousand eight hundred seventy-four dollars to be paid to the persons hereinafter enumerated, the sums stated opposite their names respectively.
