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of seven inhabitants of the state, who shall be appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, for terms of four years. The board shall be known as "Hospital Trustees." Any vacancy occurring during a term shall be filled in like manner for the remainder of the unexpired term. - Any trustee may be removed at any time by the governor and council for cause.'

Chapter 45.

An Act to Amend Section Thirty-eight of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to the Compensation of Judges of Probate in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 38; 1917, c. 167 & 292; 1919, c. 214; 1921, c. 219; relating to salaries of judges of probate, amended. Section thirty-eight of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapters one hundred and fifty-two, one hundred and sixty-seven, and two hundred and ninety-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen; by chapter two hundred and fourteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, and by chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, is hereby further amended by striking out the words "one thousand" in the twelfth line thereof, and inserting in place thereof the words 'twelve hundred and fifty,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 38. Salary of Oxford county judge increased. Judges of probate in the several counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties in monthly payments paid on the last day of each month, as follows:

Androscoggin, sixteen hundred dollars.
Aroostook, fifteen hundred dollars.
Cumberland, three thousand dollars.
Franklin, six hundred dollars.
Hancock, fifteen hundred dollars.
Kennebec, two thousand dollars.
Knox, eight hundred dollars.
Lincoln, five hundred dollars.
Oxford, twelve hundred and fifty dollars.
Penobscot, eighteen hundred dollars.
Piscataquis, eight hundred dollars.
Sagadahoc, nine hundred dollars.
Somerset, twelve hundred dollars.

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Waldo, seven hundred dollars.

Washington, twelve hundred dollars.

York, twenty-five hundred dollars, and

the fees to which they are entitled by law, except the fee provided in section forty-nine of chapter one hundred and forty-five, shall be taxed and collected and paid over by the registers of probate to the county treasurers for the use of their counties.'

Chapter 46.

An Act to Amend Section Forty-five of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to Clerk Hire in the Office of Clerk of Courts in Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 45; 1917, c. 167; 1919, c. 214; 1921, c. 219; relating to clerk hire in county offices, amended. That paragraph of section forty-five of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and sixty-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, chapter two hundred and fourteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen and chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, which relates to clerk hire in Waldo county, is hereby amended by striking out the words "five hundred" in the third line thereof and inserting in place thereof the words 'seven hundred,' so that said paragraph, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Waldo county. Clerk hire in clerk of courts office increased. For clerks in the office of register of deeds, eleven hundred and forty-four dollars; for clerks in the office of register of probate, two hundred dollars; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, seven hundred dollars.'

Chapter 47.

An Act to Amend Section Seven of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to Compensation of Judges Upon Retirement.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 7; relating to compensation of judges upon retirement, amended. Section seven of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and twenty-six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, and by chapters seven and two hundred and six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-
