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PUBLIC LAWS

Chapter 46.

An Act to Amend Section Forty-five of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to Clerk Hire in the Office of Clerk of Courts in Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 45; 1917, c. 167; 1919, c. 214; 1921, c. 219; relating to clerk hire in county offices, amended. That paragraph of section fortyfive of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and sixty-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, chapter two hundred and fourteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen and chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, which relates to clerk hire in Waldo county, is hereby amended by striking out the words "five hundred" in the third line thereof and inserting in place thereof the words 'seven hundred,' so that said paragraph, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Waldo county. Clerk hire in clerk of courts office increased. For clerks in the office of register of deeds, eleven hundred and forty-four dollars; for clerks in the office of register of probate, two hundred dollars; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, seven hundred dollars.'

Chapter 47.

An Act to Amend Section Seven of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to Compensation of Judges Upon Retirement.
