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## CHAP. 105

quarterly under oath to the county treasurers for all fees received by them or payable to them by virtue of the office, specifying the items, and shall pay the whole amount of the same to the treasurers of their respective counties quarterly on the first days of January, April, July and October of each year. They may make abstracts and copies from the records and furnish the same to persons calling for them and may charge a reasonable fee for such service, but shall not give an opinion upon the title to real estate. Fees charged by them for abstracts and copies shall be retained by them and not paid to the county.'

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### Chapter 105.

An Act to Amend Section Forty of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred and Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, Increasing the Salary of the Clerk of Judicial Courts in the County of Sagadahoc.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 117, sec. 40; P. L., 1921, c. 219; relating to salaries of clerks of courts, amended. Section forty of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, is hereby further amended by striking out in the sixteenth line of said section the words "Sagadahoc, two thousand dollars," and inserting in place thereof the words, 'Sagadahoc, twenty-one hundred dollars,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 40. Salary in Sagadahoc county increased to \$2,100. The clerks of the judicial courts in the several counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties in monthly payments paid on the last day of each month, as follows:

'Androscoggin, twenty-two hundred dollars,  
 'Aroostook, two thousand dollars,  
 'Cumberland, twenty-five hundred dollars, deputy clerk of courts, eighteen hundred dollars,  
 'Franklin, fourteen hundred dollars,  
 'Hancock, twenty-one hundred dollars,  
 'Kennebec, twenty-five hundred dollars,  
 'Knox, fifteen hundred dollars,  
 'Lincoln, twelve hundred dollars,  
 'Oxford, eighteen hundred dollars,  
 'Penobscot, twenty-five hundred dollars,  
 'Piscataquis, fourteen hundred dollars,

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'Sagadahoc, twenty-one hundred dollars,  
 'Somerset, twenty-five hundred dollars,  
 'Waldo, twelve hundred dollars,  
 'Washington, fourteen hundred and fifty dollars,  
 'York, twenty-five hundred dollars.

'The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation for the performance of all duties required of clerks, including those performed by them as clerks of the supreme judicial court, superior and county commissioners' courts, or by clerks pro tempore employed by them, and the sum provided for the clerk in Lincoln county shall be in full for all such services and also in full for services as clerk of Lincoln municipal court, except as provided in section forty-five of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes. They shall account quarterly under oath to the county treasurer for all fees received by them or payable to them by virtue of the office, except fees collected by them in naturalization proceedings under the act of congress of June twenty-ninth, nineteen hundred and six, as amended by the act of congress of June twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and ten, specifying the items, and shall pay the whole amount of the same to the treasurers of their respective counties quarterly on the first days of January, April, July and October of each year.'

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## Chapter 106.

An Act to Amend Section Forty-one of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred and Fourteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, and by Chapter Two Hundred and Nineteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, Relating to Salary of Sheriff of Aroostook County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 117, sec. 41; P. L., 1919, c. 214; 1921, c. 219; relating to salaries of sheriffs, amended. Section forty-one of chapter one hundred seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred fourteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred nineteen, as amended by chapter two hundred nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one, is hereby amended by striking out the words, "Aroostook, two thousand dollars," in the fifth line thereof and inserting in place thereof the following, 'Aroostook, twenty-five hundred dollars,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 41. Salary in Aroostook county increased to \$2,500. The sheriffs of the several counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties in monthly payments paid on the last day of each month, as follows:
