'Androscoggin, twenty-five hundred dollars,
 'Aroostook, twenty-five hundred dollars,
 'Cumberland, four thousand dollars,
 'Franklin, one thousand dollars,
 'Hancock, sixteen hundred dollars,
 'Kennebec, twenty-eight hundred dollars,
 'Knox, twelve hundred dollars,
 'Lincoln, eight hundred dollars,
 'Oxford, twelve hundred dollars,
 'Penobscot, twenty-eight hundred dollars,
 'Piscataquis, one thousand dollars,
 'Sagadahoc, fifteen hundred dollars,

'Together with free rental of the house or living apartment connected with the county jail in each county, including the necessary light and fuel. Said salaries shall be in full compensation for services in attendance upon the supreme judicial court and upon the superior courts in the counties of Cumberland and Kennebec as jailer, master or keeper of the jail in each county, for receiving and committing prisoners therein and for the service of all criminal processes and the performance of all duties relating to the enforcement of all criminal laws. Such necessary incidental expenses as are just and proper, incurred in the performance of their public duties, including all necessary expenses for aid in keeping the jails, shall be allowed by the respective boards of county commissioners of said counties and paid from county treasuries.'

Chapter 107.

An Act in Relation to Employees and Office Expenses of the Department of the
 Attorney General

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Attorney general authorized to employ clerks, and allowed office expenses. The attorney general is authorized to employ in his office in addition to the officers named in section sixty-seven of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and ten of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, additional clerks as the business of his office may demand, whose appointment and compensation shall be subject to the approval of the governor and council. He may also

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incur a reasonable expense for postage, printing, stationery, and other office expenses.

Chapter 108.

An Act to Amend Section Forty-four of Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen of the Revised Statutes, as Amended, Relating to the Salary of the County Treasurer of Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 117, sec. 44; P. L., 1917, c. 167; 1919, c. 214 and 259; 1921, c. 219; relating to salaries of county treasurers, amended. Section forty-four of chapter one hundred and seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and sixty-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, chapters two hundred and fourteen and two hundred and fifty-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen; and by chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, is hereby further amended by striking out following the word "Hancock" in the ninth line, the words "five hundred dollars," and inserting in place thereof the words "six hundred dollars," so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 44. Salary in Hancock county increased to \$600. County treasurers in the several counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties in monthly payments paid on the last day of each month, as follows:

'Androscoggin, eighteen hundred dollars,
 'Aroostook, eight hundred dollars,
 'Cumberland, two thousand dollars,
 'Franklin, four hundred dollars,
 'Hancock, six hundred dollars,
 'Kennebec, fifteen hundred dollars,
 'Knox, four hundred dollars,
 'Lincoln, three hundred dollars,
 'Oxford, six hundred fifty dollars,
 'Penobscot, eighteen hundred dollars,
 'Piscataquis, five hundred dollars,
 'Sagadahoc, five hundred dollars,
 'Somerset, six hundred dollars,
 'Waldo, four hundred dollars,
 'Washington, seven hundred dollars.
 'York, eight hundred fifty dollars.
