CHAP. 111

Chapter 111.

An Act to Legalize and Make Valid the Proceedings of the Town Meeting of the Town of Washburn, Held on March Twenty-sixth, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Town meeting held March 26, 1923, ratified. The town meeting of the town of Washburn, held on the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, is hereby ratified and made legal and valid and all the proceedings of said meeting are hereby ratified, confirmed and made legal.

Approved April 4, 1923.

Chapter 112.

An Act Relating to Improvements on Nash Stream and the East and West Branches Thereof in Coplin Plantation, and in the Township of Redington in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Authorized to erect and maintain dams for log driving purposes; Albion L. Savage of Stratton in the county of Franklin and state of Maine, his associates, successors and assigns are hereby authorized and empowered to locate, erect and maintain in Nash stream and the east and west branches thereof, on land owned by Hollingsworth & Whitney Company and others in Coplin Plantation, and land owned by Chandler and Hovey or others in the township of Redington in the county of Franklin and state of Maine, anywhere on said Nash stream, or the east and west branches thereof, between and including the dam on the east branch of said Nash stream and located on or near the south line of said Coplin Plantation, and including the dam on the west branch of said Nash stream. and located about one-fourth of a mile south of the south line of said Coplin Plantation, and the north line of said Coplin Plantation, such dams as may be necessary, including the two dams above mentioned and already erected and maintained by him, to raise a head of water to facilitate the driving of logs, pulpwood and other lumber, down said Nash stream and the east and west branches thereof; and to build side dams, piers and rack booms, remove rocks, and make other improvements on said Nash stream and the east and west branches thereof, and their tributaries, within the limits of said Coplin Plantation, and in the township of Redington only to the dams above mentioned and already built, for the purpose of facilitating the driving of logs, pulpwood and other lumber down the same.

Sec. 2. Right of eminent domain conferred. Said Albion L. Savage, his associates, successors and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to take lands and materials necessary to build and maintain such dams
