CHAP. 20

fiscal year July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, inclusive, the sum of seventy-three thousand eight hundred dollars for the purposes hereinafter specified, namely:

July 1, 1923—June 30, 1924.

Personal services of officers and employees, fifty thousand dollars,	\$50,000.00
Maintenance, including food supplies, clothing, repairs on buildings and general expenses, twenty thousand dollars,	\$20,000.00
Retiring and pensioning prison officials, three thousand eight hundred dollars,	\$3,800.00

And be it further resolved that there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the Maine state prison for the fiscal year July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, inclusive, the further sum of seventy-three thousand eight hundred dollars for the same purpose hereinbefore specified, divided as follows, namely:

Personal services of officers and employees, fifty thousand dollars,	\$50,000.00
Maintenance, including food supplies, clothing, repairs on buildings and general expenses, twenty thousand dollars,	\$20,000.00
Retiring and pensioning prison officials, three thousand eight hundred dollars,	\$3,800.00

Chapter 20.

Resolve, Providing for the Purchase of Reports of the Commemoration of a Century of Peace Between the United States and Canada of the Maine State Bar Association.

Maine State Bar Association, to purchase report. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars for the purchase from the Maine State Bar Association, copies of the report of the commemoration of a century of peace between the United States and Canada, which are to be printed by the said association, at the same cost per copy as the cost to the association; said volumes to be distributed or exchanged at the discretion of the state librarian.
