CHAP. 77

twenty-two thousand dollars; for the period from July first, nineteen hundred twenty-four, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-five, the sum of twenty-two thousand dollars.

For **maintenance**, namely, all articles of food and all other materials, supplies and expenses incident to maintenance of the institution and for the patients thereof, whether present or absent, for the period from July first, nineteen hundred twenty-three, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-four, the sum of forty-six thousand dollars; for the period from July first, nineteen hundred twenty-four, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-five, the sum of forty-six thousand dollars.

For **repairs and improvements**, for the period from July first, nineteen hundred twenty-three, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-four, the sum of three thousand dollars; for the period from July first, nineteen hundred twenty-four, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-five, the sum of three thousand dollars.

For **finishing basement**, adding X-ray machine, sterilizer, high pressure boiler, and quarters for the help in the new building, the sum of ten thousand dollars for the year of nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Chapter 77.

Resolve, in Favor of the Bath Military and Naval Orphan Asylum.

Bath Military and Naval Orphan Asylum. Resolved: That there be paid to the Bath Military and Naval Orphan Asylum for **maintenance**, fourteen thousand five hundred dollars for the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four; and fourteen thousand five hundred dollars for the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

That there be paid for **personal services** in the aforementioned institution, six thousand and five hundred dollars for the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four; and six thousand and five hundred dollars for the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

That there be paid for **repairs and equipment**, two thousand dollars for the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four; and one thousand dollars for

the fiscal year from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Chapter 78.

Resolve, in Favor of the State School for Boys for Maintenance and Other Purposes.

State school for boys. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for maintenance of the state school for boys, the following sums:

For personal services, namely, salaries and wages of all officers and employees, except those wholly engaged in repairs and construction of buildings and equipment:

For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of twenty thousand dollars	\$20,000.00
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For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, the sum of twenty thousand dollars	20,000.00
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For maintenance, including food supplies, clothing, and all materials and supplies incident to the maintenance of the institution and the inmates thereof:

For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of thirty-two thousand dollars	32,000.00
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For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, the sum of thirty-two thousand dollars	32,000.00
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For repairs and equipment for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four the sum of fifteen thousand dollars	15,000.00
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For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five the sum of fifteen thousand dollars	15,000.00
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For rebuilding the piggery which was destroyed by fire, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars	1,500.00
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This sum to be additional to the amount received for insurance on said destroyed piggery and to be available for expenditure during the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.
