Chapter 78.

Resolve, in Favor of the State School for Boys for Maintenance and Other Purposes.

State school for boys. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for maintenance of the state school for boys, the following sums:

For personal services, namely, salaries and wages of all officers and employees, except those wholly engaged in repairs and construction of buildings and equipment:

For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of twenty thousand dollars	\$20,000.00
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For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, the sum of twenty thousand dollars	20,000.00
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For maintenance, including food supplies, clothing, and all materials and supplies incident to the maintenance of the institution and the inmates thereof:

For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of thirty-two thousand dollars	32,000.00
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For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, the sum of thirty-two thousand dollars	32,000.00
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For repairs and equipment for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four the sum of fifteen thousand dollars	15,000.00
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For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five the sum of fifteen thousand dollars	15,000.00
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For rebuilding the piggery which was destroyed by fire, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars	1,500.00
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This sum to be additional to the amount received for insurance on said destroyed piggery and to be available for expenditure during the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

For the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of forty-two dollars	42.00

Chapter 79.

Resolve, Appropriating Money for the Maine School for the Deaf.

Maine School for Deaf. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the Maine School for the Deaf, for the year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of twenty-seven thousand dollars for personal services; fourteen thousand dollars for maintenance, and three thousand dollars for repairs and equipment; and for the year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, the sum of twenty-seven thousand dollars for personal services, fourteen thousand dollars for maintenance, and three thousand dollars for repairs and equipment.

Chapter 80.

Resolve, Providing Aid in the Control and Suppression of the European Corn Borer.

European corn borer, appropriation for suppression. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars in nineteen hundred twenty-four, and seven thousand five hundred dollars in nineteen hundred twenty-five, to be expended under direction of the commissioner of agriculture for the control and suppression of the insect known as the European corn borer, and in educational work among the farmers of the state for the same purpose.

Chapter 81.

Resolve, Authorizing the Attorney-General to Procure Pictures of Former Attorneys-General and Appropriating Money Therefor.

Attorney general authorized to procure pictures of former attorneys general. Resolved: That the attorney-general is hereby authorized to procure for the attorney-general's office in the state house, suitable framed pictures of the former attorneys-general of Maine at an expense not to exceed two hundred dollars, which sum or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for that purpose from any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
