Resolved:** That there be paid from the state treasury, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for the benefit of said tribe for the period from July first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, as follows:

### Chapter 91.

Resolve, Providing a State Pension for Mrs. Cora V. Swift of Portland.

**Cora V. Swift, state pension.** Resolved: That there be paid to Mrs. Cora V. Swift of Portland, in the county of Cumberland and state of Maine, widow of the late Robert B. Swift, the sum of eight dollars per month, payable quarterly, from the fund appropriated for military pensions beginning January first, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, and continuing until otherwise provided by the legislature.

### Chapter 92.

Resolve, in Favor of the State School for Girls for Maintenance and Other Purposes.

**State school for girls.** Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for maintenance of the state school for girls, the following sums:

For Personal Services, namely, for salaries and wages of all officers and employees except those wholly engaged in repairs of buildings and equipment, for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, the sum of twenty-two thousand dollars	\$22,000.00
